

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Jesus said "What is written in the Bible?" The man replied "Love the Lord, your God, with all your soul, strength and heart. And love your neighbor as yourself."






"That's right! Do this, and you will live forever, in Heaven" Jesus told him. "But, who is my neighbor?" asked the man.

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


Jesus started to tell a story. "There was once a Jewish man, walking along a road. He was travelling to Jericho from Jerusalem. This would take I-2 days of walking.




The road was rocky with lots of hills. The man was humming to himself when a group of men jumped out at him.

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The group of men took the Jewish mans belongings and ripped off most of his clothes. They beat him up and left him lying there, bleeding.




Soon, a priest walked down the path. He pretended not to see the Jewish man. He crossed the road and didn't help him.

Anyone could see that the Jewish man was badly hurt, laying on the floor. He was bleeding, had few clothes left and was hardly breathing.

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
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Then, a Samaritan walked past. Samaritan's didn't like Jews, because Jews didn't treat the Samaritans very well.

When the Samaritan saw the man he went over to help him. He put bandages on him and lifted him onto his donkey to take him to a hotel.

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
The next day, the Samaritan paid the hotel to look after the man until he was better. He asked if the man wasn't better after 2 months, he would return and pay the extra.
